

## James G. Faluszczak

James G. Faluszczak, 50, who is not a member of the bar, is a nationally known, internationally quoted Catholic Church whistleblower. A former 18-year parish priest, as a teenager Faluszczak was sexually assaulted for three consecutive years by his parish priest. Raised in Erie, Pennsylvania, and living two blocks from the church whose priest abused him, Faluszczak graduated from Christ the King Seminary in Buffalo, New York. He was called to the priesthood in spite of the abuse he suffered. As a priest, Faluszczak encountered his first iconoclastic experience with church hierarchy when he disclosed his abuse as a teenager to then Bishop of Erie in 2010 and again later to his successor in 2014. Neither took any action. Later, Faluszczak learned that the priest had already been restricted from the ministry during the time he abused Faluszczak.

After ordination, Faluszczak spent his years as a priest in the Diocese of Erie, before quitting in 2014 to become the frequently interviewed and quoted whistleblower he is today.

# **Childhood Victim Himself**

Like many victims of childhood sexual assault, in adulthood Faluszczak self-medicated, as he suffered from tremors, panic attacks and, as he described it, "debilitating anxiety." All around him he was revolted by the "secret lifestyles of diocesan priests and the culture in which the are formed," he said. "The church enables sub-cultural behaviors," he added.

"For 20 some years I suffered with this alone," he told WBEN television news in Buffalo, New York. His alcohol abuse is now well under control, he said, adding that he suspects that "most dioceses have a problem of this same nature." Once sober, he told this station in another interview, "I found it nearly impossible to function with all these constant reminders [of my abuse]."

### **Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report**

In Pennsylvania, Faluszczak testified before a special grand jury that, in August 2018, ended a two-year-investigation naming more than 300 Catholic priests in six Keystone State dioceses who sexually abused children over more than six decades, and how their actions were covered up.

Today, Faluszczak continues to speak out and demonstrate against church abusers and the church culture. In his law firm affiliation with Phillips & Paolicelli, LLP, he helps coordinate intake and contact with clients who are adult survivors of child sex assault, and maintains contact with Catholics and attorneys in the Erie, Pennsylvania and Buffalo, New York areas.
