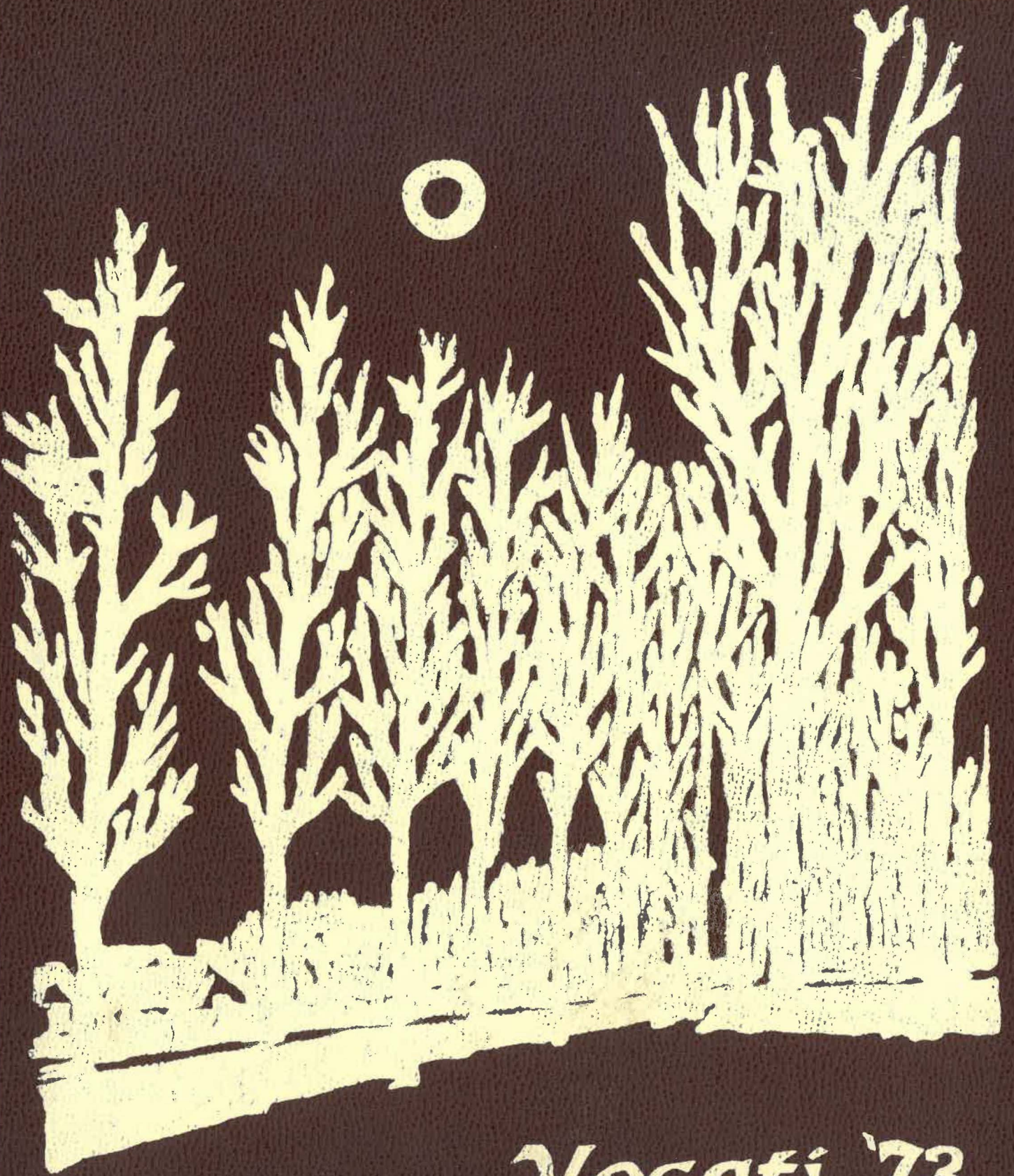
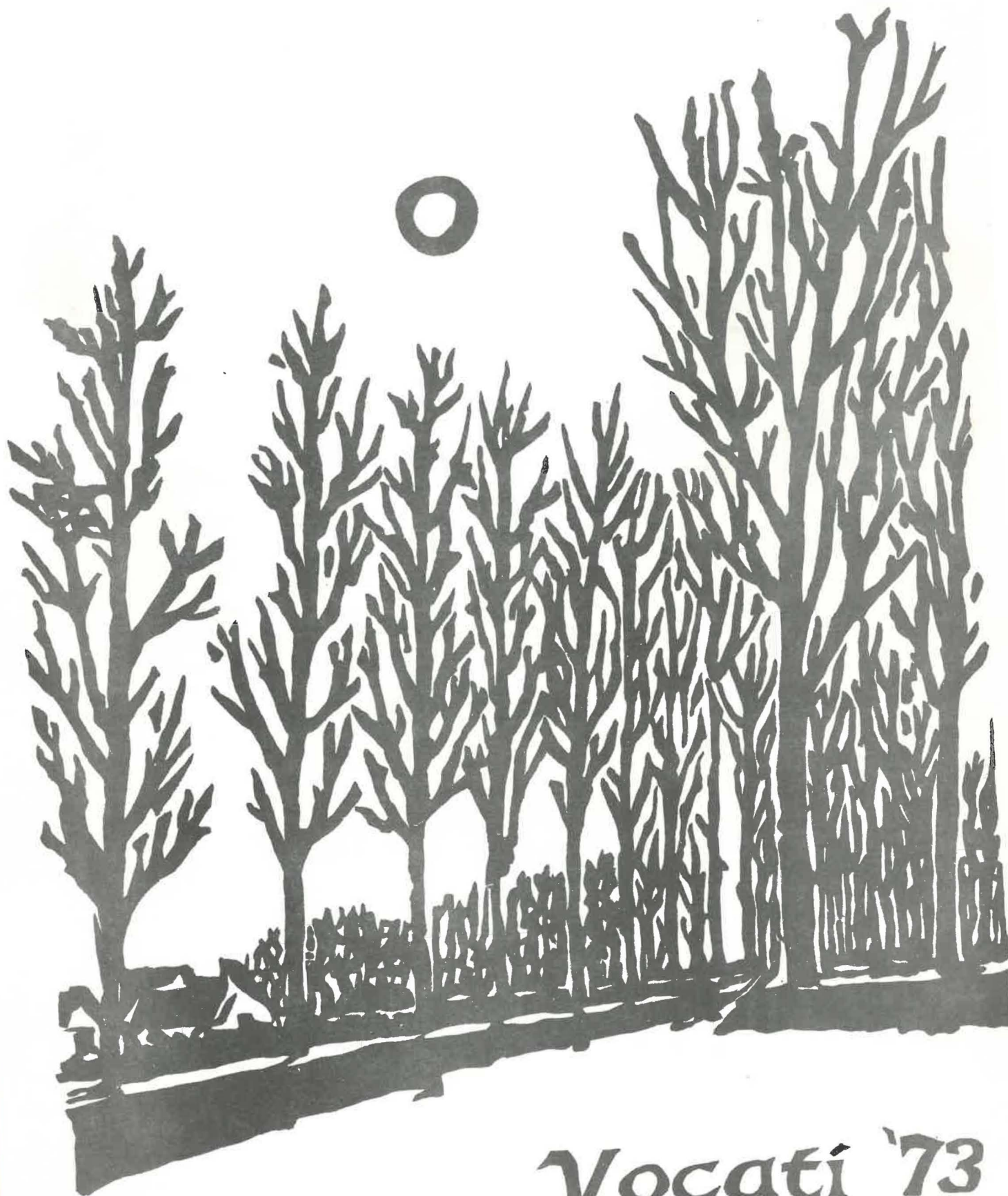

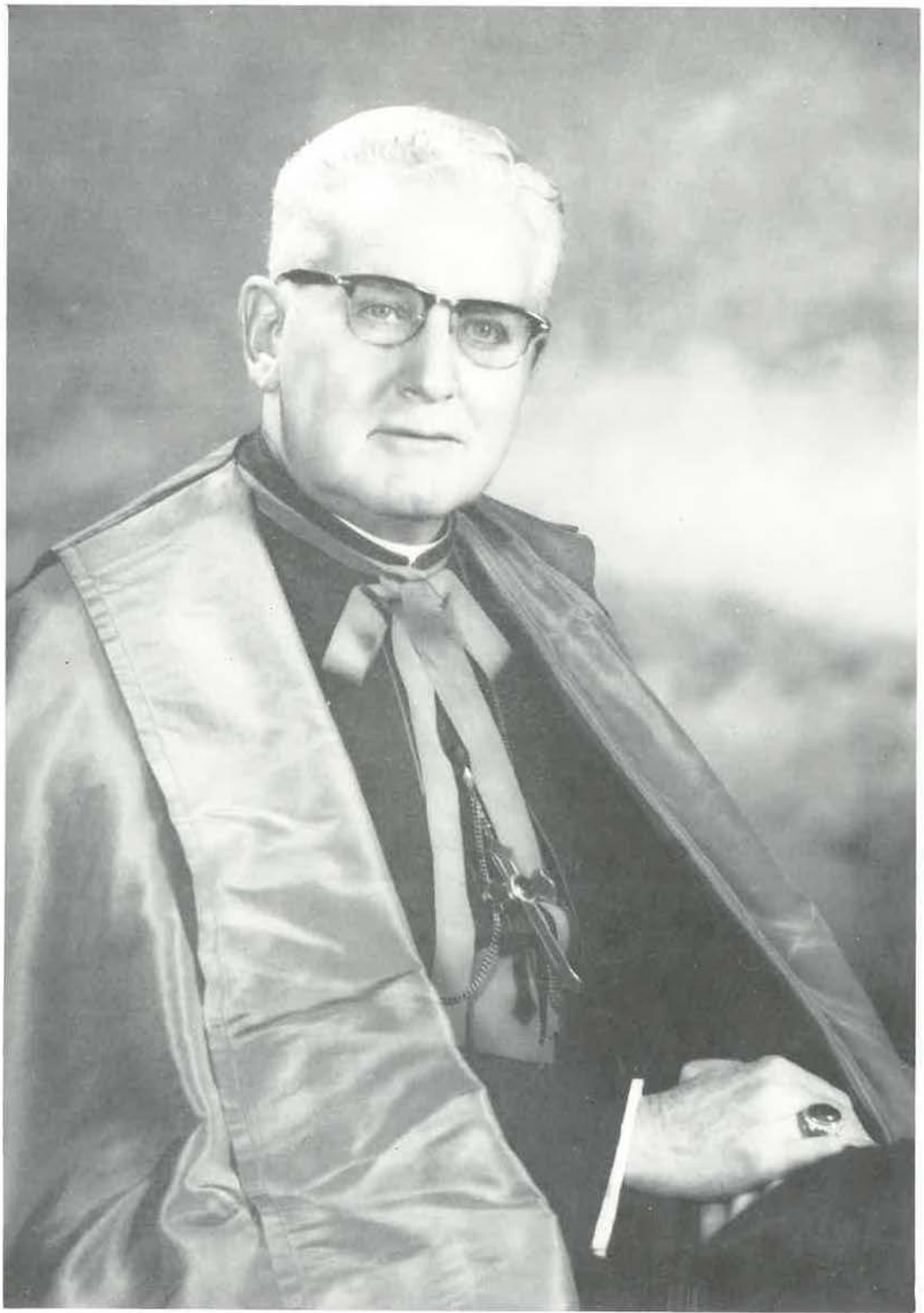

the road not taken

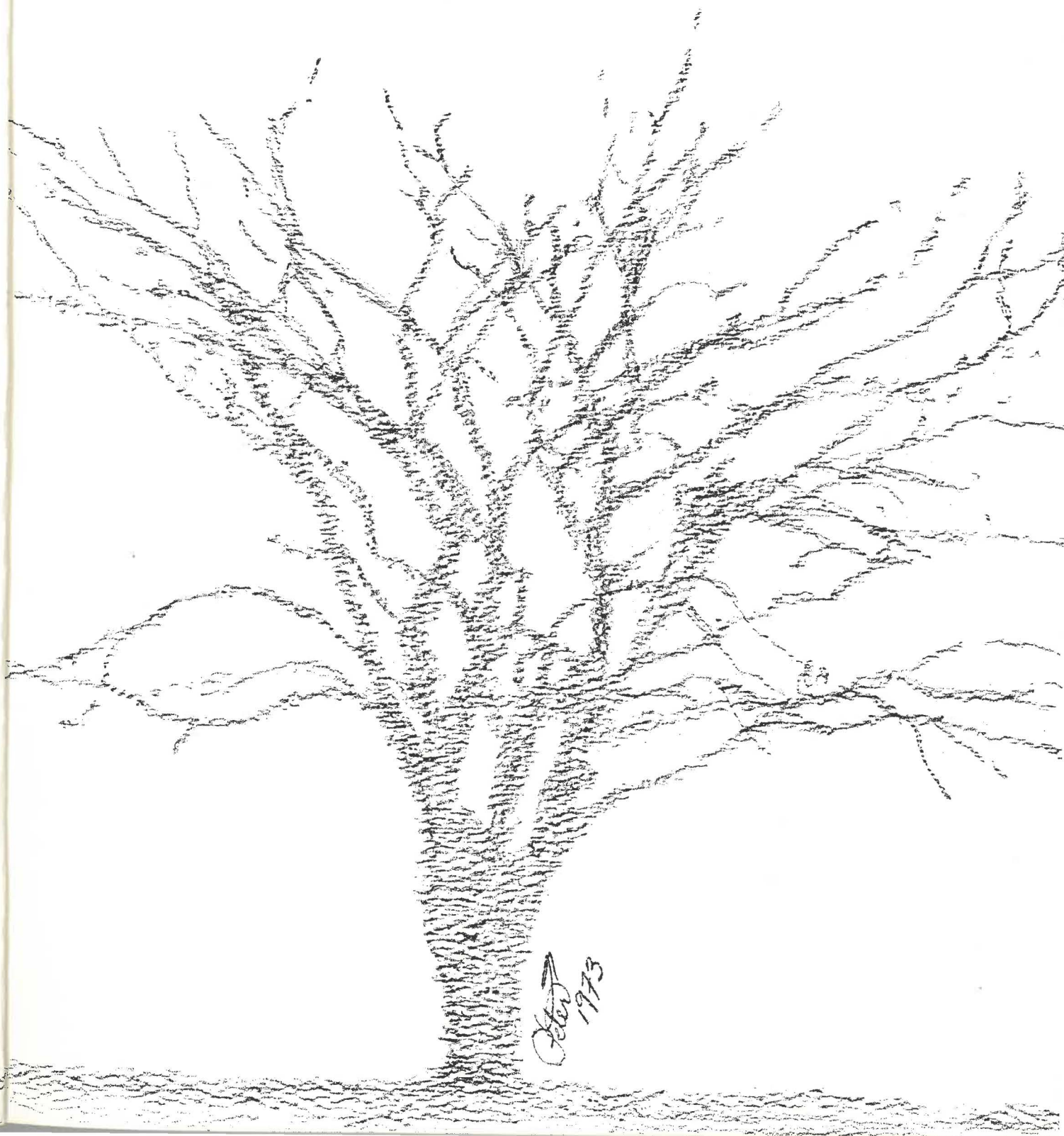
two roads diverged in a yellow wood,

I doubted if I should ever come back.

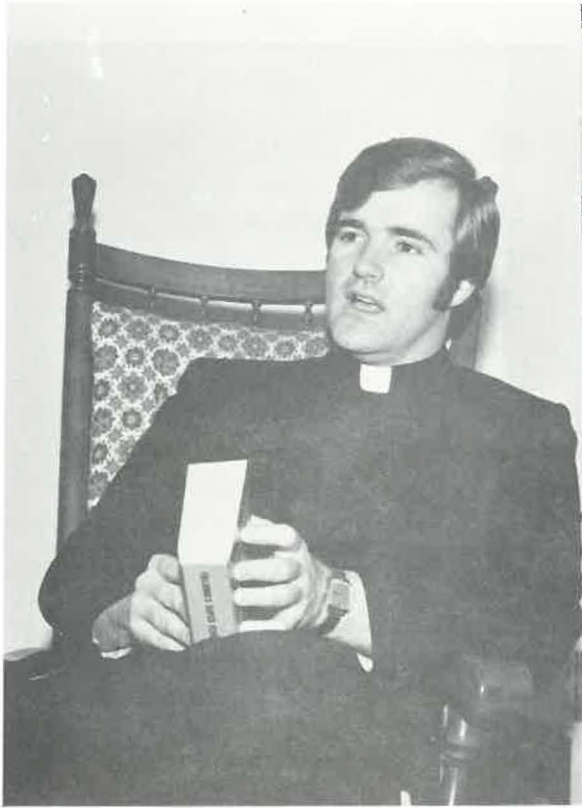
